## What is a Fractured Fairy Tale?

A Fractured Fairy Tale is a retelling of a classing fairy tale, with some sort of twist added. It explores the original tale from a different angle, changing it by exploring a "what if" question to make an original story. Sometimes the twist in a Fractured Fairy Tale makes the story darker or changes the happy ending, but the story doesn't have to be darker and grittier unless you want it to be!
